

Discussion Questions

- Bunny and Vee became friends instantly, and had an immediate connection. Have you ever felt like this with your real friends, or any of your toys who you consider a friend?
- This story is told from the point of view of Bunny, rather than Vee. How do you think the story would have been different if Vee was telling the story?
- Why do you think that Bunny thought that Vee was 'sassy and clever'?
- If a friend of yours was to describe you, what two words do you think they would use?
- Bunny and Vee loved spending time together. What games and activities did Vee and Bunny like to do together?
- What are your favourite activities to do with your toys and your friends?
- How did Bunny feel when she got left behind?
- How was Vee feeling about losing Bunny?
- Can you recall the name of the bird that dumped Bunny in the trash?
- Both Vee and Bunny felt a sense of loss and despair when Bunny was lost. Have you ever lost something special to you? If so, what was it and did you ever find it?
- Why did Bunny think that Vee wouldn't want her anymore, when she was found all dirty and tattered?
- How did Vee react when Grandad brought Bunny home?
- Did it matter to her that Bunny was tattered and torn? What did this tell you about how special Bunny was to Vee?

Activities:

- Draw a picture of yourself and your favourite thing in a love heart, just like the picture of Bunny and Vee at the back of the book.
- From memory, recall five items that were in Vee's bedroom. Make a list of them and compare your list with others in your class.
